FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Enforceable Statements

One of the essential skills taught by Jim Fay in Love and Logic is the use of enforceable statements when speaking with children. Enforceable statements place 'ownership' in the hands of the adult and the 'decision making' in the hands of the students. Thus, in our classrooms, you will hear teachers using phrases such as:

- "I grade papers placed in this bin."
- "I take a quiet line to lunch."
- "I call on students who raise their hands."
- "I talk with students whose voices are as calm as mine."

We have found a high rate of success with classroom management when implementing enforceable statements!

We encourage you to try this technique at home. Good luck!

Identification Badges: All adults on campus are required to wear identification badges at all times. Parents and other visitors are required to report to the office and show proper identification upon arrival at the campus, sign in and obtain a visitor's badge. Any adult who is not properly identified either by a district or visitor's badge will be immediately directed to the office. *Even if you are stopping by campus for a brief lunch visit, a parent conference, to read to a class, or even to help out in your child's classroom, you must sign in at the front office. Thank you for helping to keep safety a priority at HCE.*

School Day Interruptions: Parents or visitors may not proceed to the classrooms without first checking in at the office and receiving permission. No interruptions to the school day will be permitted except those of an emergency nature. Parents are required to bring forgotten items or items needing delivery directly to the office. Office staff members will deliver the items to the classrooms without interrupting instruction. Delivery of forgotten homework is not permissible. Middle school students may not visit campus during the day. All visits by former students must take place after school hours.

Red Ribbon Week Activities

- Have children be very cautious of strangers and pets they do not know.
- Always check the treats before children eat them.
- Have children take a cell phone with them, if possible.

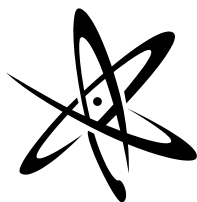
Attention 4th and 5th graders and their parents!

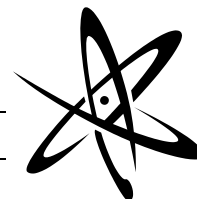

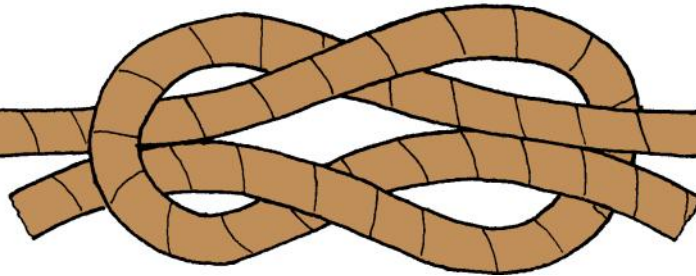
HCE Dads, Cowboy Up & Join Us!
