Campus Improvement Team Meeting minutes

9-15-2011

A. Mrs. Roach began the meeting by talking with the committee about the new recess plan that was implemented at the onset of the year. She reminded the group that this committee had discussed concerns related to bullying at recess for the past 2 years, as documented in the minutes of the committee work throughout the previous two years. She reiterated that our data suggests that 56-62% of students identified bullying as an issue at HCE, with a large percentage (37%) in the spring of 2011 noting that exclusionary and bullying acts were occurring particularly at recess. She explained that based on the April 2011 CIT meeting, in which Mrs. Luburger expressed that a plan was in the creation phase, a plan had been indeed formed and was in full operation, as students returned to school in August. The plan eliminates the need for ‘team captains’ and also affords all students the opportunity to play team sports on designated days. Mrs. Luburger then described research, which supports the idea of addressing both the short and long-term affects that bullying can have on children. She also discussed the alignment between *Love and Logic* and the need for adults to intervene when children are unable to resolve serious issues on their own. Furthermore, HCE administrators spoke with Charles Fay, co-creator of *Love and Logic*, to ensure alignment. Finally, Mrs. Henry summarized the feedback that HCE administrators had received from parents in the community. Both concerns and celebrations were highlighted. Mrs. Roach then asked members of the CIT and audience to share any feedback about ideas to consider as we moved forward with our plan. Administrators will consistently monitor the plan with the input of parents, teachers, and students via the Leadership Council and classroom visits. Many ideas, from parents and CIT members, were presented for consideration. Mrs. Roach will report back to the CIT in October on the success of the plan and any changes that will be incorporated for the 2nd nine weeks of school.

B. Mrs. Roach then discussed, in general terms, key components of the new Spring Branch Plan that will come into effect in July 2012. This ‘district roadmap’ will include an overarching goal, critical measures, secondary measures, action plans and components of internal accountability. Dr. Klussmann, senior staff members, district staff and SBISD Board members have been working on this document for several months. More information is forthcoming this fall.

C. Mrs. Roach shared that additional staff have been added thus far in Kindergarten, 2nd and 4th grade. Campus enrollment projections, created at the central office level, were not aligned with the number of students to enroll, thus additional staffing units, in these particular grades, were given to the campus.

Mrs. Roach ended the meeting by highlighting several aspects of the HCE Campus Improvement Plan. This plan is our campus ‘roadmap’ for the year. For the 2011-2012 year, while many activities have been noted, some of particular interest are in the area of technology, small group math instruction, rigor and relevance for the sake of increased student engagement, the environment as it relates to the elimination of bullying, and coordinated student health. Look for more specific information about these targeted areas in future newsletters.

Meeting Minutes

A. Introductions: Returning members and new members were recognized. Mona Read will serve as our parent representative again this year.

B. Purpose: The purpose of CSHAC was explained. The goal of the committee is to promote healthy living including the physical, mental, and social well being of the child. CSHAC focuses on student health. There are 8 components to the program which includes: family and community involvement, health education, physical education, school health services, school nutrition services, counseling services, healthy school environment, and health promotion for school personnel.

C. Counselor's Role and CSHAC: One of the components of CSHAC focuses on counseling services along with the physical, mental, and social well being of the student. Therefore, Mrs. Luburger will join the CSHAC committee as a member.

D. Goals for 2011-12: The committee received an overview of how the goals were developed. Each team received one module to review at the end of last year and noted areas of strength as well as areas needing additional focus. The goals were developed from feedback from the teams which will include: Student/Family awareness of healthy eating choices including snacks and drinks, asthma and allergy awareness for families and staff, and stress management for staff. Members brainstormed activities for goals which include: Student awareness of healthy eating choices will be addressed through newsletter articles, morning announcements, posters, and class integration. Our nurse, Mercedes Mulvey will address asthma and allergy awareness to staff and parents through faculty meeting presentations, a PTA meeting, and newsletter articles. Stress management for staff was discussed with ideas that included searching for discounts at various health related clubs, healthy food venues, and providing a stress relief class that focuses on brain research provided by Rachel Odom in the spring. This class will provide teachers with physical activity ideas that can be utilized in the classroom with students.

E. Healthier US School Challenge – SBISD's Child Nutrition Services is applying for a Bronze level award through this challenge offered by the USDA and is asking all schools in SBISD to participate. This challenge recognizes schools that create healthier school environments by providing nutrition education, nutritious food and beverage choices, physical education, and opportunities for physical activities. More information will be gathered and shared at the next meeting.

F. Health Fair – Our school nurse, Mercedes Mulvey, discussed the possibility of holding a Health Fair this year. The committee suggested holding the Fair to coincide with Field Day in November. Our parent liaison, Mona Read, will work with Nurse Mulvey to secure vendors to participate in the Fair. This item will be discussed again at our next meeting.

G. District CSHAC meeting – Coach Abshire is our liaison to the district CSHAC meetings and will bring back pertinent information that is shared to our campus meetings.

H. Next meeting: Tuesday, October 11th at 3:15

To prepare our students to function successfully in the 21st century, SBISD has recognized that we must move away from a computation-dominated curriculum, in which students learn isolated procedures by rote, to a curriculum that stresses problem solving, understanding, and applications. This type of curriculum is best taught in a small group setting because it allows for close monitoring by the teacher and immediate feedback for the student.

Small group instruction in Math is an integral part of the overall Math vision in SBISD. Teachers are required to have 90 minutes of Math each day and meeting with small groups of students provides teachers with much needed information about each student's progress. It is the core of differentiated instruction, which is a process through which teachers enhance learning by matching student needs to instruction. It allows students to access the same classroom curriculum by providing entry points, learning tasks, and outcomes that are tailored to students' needs. This model allows the teacher to give guidance to those who are struggling and see how and when any misconceptions are occurring and then correct these mistakes in a more private manner. It also provides the opportunity to challenge those students who may need extension of the topic being taught. For the student progressing as expected, it allows time for questions to be answered and reassurances to be given.

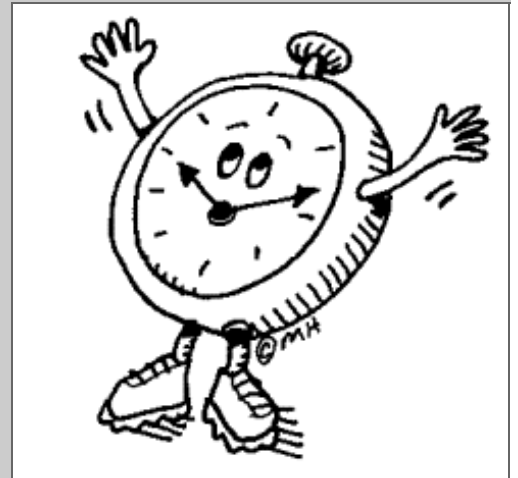
Using the small group instructional model is the standard at HCE and your children are benefitting from these opportunities to achieve and succeed in the world of Mathematics.

HCE POLICY CORNER

Absence Policy:

The Texas Education Code requires compulsory attendance. This means that any child enrolled in a public school must attend class at least 90% of the school year (180 days). In addition, public schools are accountable for attendance under the federal No Child Left Behind Act. This act states that public schools are evaluated for Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in the area of attendance for elementary grades. In order to achieve a gold performance acknowledgement, which is the highest rating, we must have our children attending school 97% of the school year. Our goal this year is to achieve the gold performance acknowledgement for attendance. Therefore, you can help by making sure that your child attends school on a regular basis and is on time. Please remember to schedule trips and vacations when school is not in session. As always, your support is greatly appreciated.



Absences:

For safety reasons, parents of students who are absent should phone the front office by 9:15 a.m. If notification is not received by 9:45 a.m. on the date of the absence, then parents will receive a phone call. A note or email explaining the reason for the absence is required and should be sent to your child's teacher as well as emailing our campus registrar, Janis Causey (Janis.Causey@springbranchisd.com). If a note/email is not received within two school days of a student's return, the absence will be considered unexcused.

Unexcused Absences:

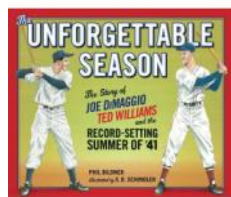
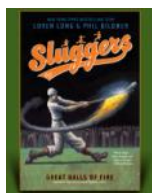
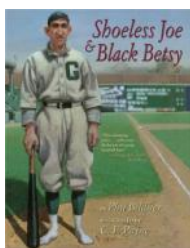
When a student receives three (3) unexcused absences within a four (4) week period, a warning letter is sent to the parent of the student by the District Attorney's office as part of SBISD's "Stay in School" initiative that began last school year. Parents receiving a letter are then required to meet with school officials to discuss absences. If a student continues to incur additional unexcused absences, charges will be filed in a Justice of the Peace Court.

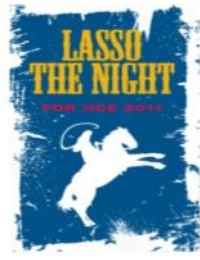
